

### What does apache mean to us


There is a hierarchical organisation,



# (Apache) Cloudstack, prehistory

Before, when animals still could speak; https://www.cloud.com/

- launched as VMops in 2010
- rebranded as cloud.com in 2010
- bought by Citrix in July 2011 and released as 2.x
- made open source by citrix as releases 3.y

- cloudstack Citrix continued to develop CitrixCloudPlatform as a commercial fork of the project.
- CloudPlatform was sold to Accelerite in January 2016
- neither of these companies are now involved in the CloudStack project
- Accelerite continues to support their latest release 4.15, but no updates so far

when are binding votes needed example technical issues are decided by the committers on the basis of input of all contributors involved. The task of the PMC is 'just' to guard that in this instance rules on lazy consensus and/or technical votes are adhered to.


